



Elkton is located on the Colonial Highway of America, sitting at the northern headwaters of the Chesapeake Bay. Elkton, the County Seat for Cecil County, is comfortably nestled midway between Washington, DC and New York City. Elkton is very fortunate to have the comforts, charm, and atmosphere of a small town with all the advantages of larger cities such as Baltimore, MD and Philadelphia, PA just minutes away.



A Little History

In 1608, the land on which the Town now sits was named “Head of Elk” by the English explorer Captain John Smith. In 1681, the original tract of land was given to Nicholas Painter who named it “Friendship”. The Town that evolved was known as “Head of Elk” until 1787, when it was incorporated as “Elkton”. The Town became an early shipping point for the wheat grown in the rich piedmont surrounding the settlement. The Big and Little Elk creeks also supplied water power for small paper and textile factories in the early nineteenth century.



The Building Department is responsible for review of all building construction plans, site plans, and coordination of other agencies' reviews. We handle the review and issuance of building permits for both residential and commercial properties. We provide inspections of structures under construction or renovation to ensure they are in compliance with zoning regulations and required housing or building codes.

The following list provides information for projects that require a building permit:

- Additions, basement finishing, decks, demolition, fences, garages, new homes, pools, renovation, sheds, signs, solar panels, stairs and utility work (plumbing, gas, HVAC, etc.)
- Any electrical work must be done by a Cecil County Licensed Electrician. The Electrician is responsible for obtaining a permit and coordinating inspections.


Note: This list is not all-inclusive. Call the Zoning Department at 410-398-4999 for specific information.

Additionally, the Building Department reviews and processes requests for variances and special exceptions if required by zoning regulations.

We interact with other agencies such as: Maryland Department of the Environment, Cecil County Health Department, Maryland State Fire Marshal and the Soil Conservation Service.


The Planning Department is responsible for administering and recommending amendments to Elkton's elected officials on land use regulations, and coordinates reviews of site plans, subdivisions, annexations, rezoning, special exceptions, and other land-planning issues for compliance with various applicable laws.

The Planning Department is also responsible for grant research, and application and administration of state and federal grants such as the Community Development Block Grant, Critical Area Grant, Community Legacy, Sidewalk Retrofit, Maryland Historical Trust and Program Open Space Grants.




The Planning Department serves as staff liaison to the Mayor and Commissioners, the Elkton Planning Commission, and the Elkton Historic District Commission. The Department assists the Planning Commission with preparation of the Comprehensive Plan, and implements goals and objectives of the Plan through the administration of the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Program, Floodplain Regulations, Forest Conservation Ordinance and other land use laws.

The Planning Director represents the Town and Cecil County municipalities on the regional transportation planning agency - the Wilmington Area Planning Council Technical Advisory Committee (WILMAPCO TAC) and represents Elkton on the WILMAPCO Data and Demographics Subcommittee. The Director represents Elkton and the other Cecil County municipalities on the Cecil County Watershed Implementation Plan Technical Advisory Committee (WIP ADCOM). The Director is also a member of the Cecil County Economic Development Commission and the Land Use Subcommittee, and is on the Board of Directors for the Historic Elk Landing Foundation. The Director also attends meetings of the Elkton Alliance and provides updates on development activities in the Town.

Mission Statement

The Elkton Police Department mission is to improve the quality of life for Elkton's citizens through professionalism, integrity and impartiality in law enforcement services.

Our Presence in the Elkton Community

The Elkton Police Department (EPD) is a progressive, full-service agency committed to excellence in policing and service to the Elkton community. The Patrol Division is the “backbone” of the Elkton Police Department. It is comprised of four squads, which work a rotating twelve-hour schedule to provide continuous twenty-four-hour coverage to the citizens of Elkton.

EPD Officers handle approximately 20,000 calls per year, resulting in over 1000 arrests, including persons arrested for Driving While Intoxicated and drug violations. The Patrol Division consists of officers specially trained as accident re-constructionists, firearms instructors, field training officers, ASP and self-defense instructors, and Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) officers.

Recruitment

The selection and retention of qualified and highly motivated Police Officers are essential to the EPD mission. Elkton Police Department personnel enjoy competitive compensation and operate in an interactive team environment. Preference will be given to individuals who are Certified Police Officers.

The Department of Public Works is here to maintain the appearance of the Town of Elkton to make the residence and business owners proud of their community. We have over 35 employees, representing the Town of Elkton, who take great pride in their job. The Department's success relies on the specialized clusters that handle different functions within the town.



The Town of Elkton prohibits the flushing of baby wipes, diapers, cloth items, food wrappers, and other solid, non-dispersible matter into the sewer system. These items clog important wastewater pumping equipment and are detrimental to the Town's wastewater collection and treatment system. Please place these items in the trash for collection. Thank you!

TRASH COLLECTION

Monday and Tuesday are
trash collection days

Thursday and Friday are recyclables only collection days.

Holidays

When your trash or recyclables collection falls on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving or Christmas Day, your trash or recyclables will be collected on the following day. All services for the remainder of that week will be one day behind. Holiday schedule changes are posted on the Town's website at www.elkton.org.

Weather Related Delays

When trash or recyclables collection is delayed due to weather, please call 410-392-6636 or visit the Town's Website at www.elkton.org for information. All services for the remainder of that week may be one day behind.

***Please Note: The Town of Elkton and Waste Management DO NOT provide "bulk" collection services, or collection for evictions/ moving out.**

THE TOWN DOES NOT SUPPLY TRASH/ RECYCLABLE CONTAINERS. Trash and recyclables containers with lids should be used to present trash and recyclables for collection.

DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES A maximum of **two (2) containers** are permitted per household. Place containers curb or street side after 7:00pm on the day prior to collection, and before 6:00am on the day of collection. Please remove containers no later than 7:00pm the day of collection.

Household Appliances & Furniture Collection

Household appliances and furniture (One (1) large item per week) are collected at the same time as regular trash. Items that use Freon, i.e., refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers or similar appliances, must have Freon professionally removed. When placing a refrigerator or freezer out for collection, please remove the door to these appliances. **No wooden furniture will be accepted.**

Prohibited Trash

Items prohibited for curbside collection include:

*Hazardous materials of any kind (antifreeze, oil, paint, batteries, etc.).

*Construction or Demolition materials (flooring, cabinets, carpet, paneling, insulation, drywall, lumber, shingles, windows, bricks, concrete or asphalt, countertops, toilets and sinks), or any trash or debris placed by any contractor.

*Tree stumps; vegetation debris as a result of clearing unimproved properties, flower beds or gardens. No yard waste will be picked up by Waste Management. Refer to brush collection schedule provided by DPW.

*Any item that is too large or too heavy to be safely handled by collection personnel will not be removed.

Residents can safely dispose of oil, tires (**without rims**), antifreeze, and household batteries at the Department of Public Works facility. Please call 410-392-6636 for details.

- Latex only paint can be taken by residents to the Cecil County Landfill free of charge.

Oil based paint and stains need to be filled with an absorbent and taken to the Cecil County Landfill by the resident.

BRUSH, GRASS & LEAF



COLLECTION



The daily route begins at 6:30 a.m. The Department of Public Works (DPW) asks that all residents place their grass, leaves and/or brush out **the night before**. DPW cannot return to areas previously serviced that day.

Please Note: Collection routes are weather permitting. When grass, leaves and brush get wet, they may not be picked up on collection day; wet materials can damage equipment.

Building materials (fencing, drywall, etc.), dirt, and mulch will not be picked up.

Do not place grass, leaves and/or brush in bags. You can place grass in a container marked "GRASS" in four (4) inch letters. Containers must not exceed 32 gallons.

Brush should be no longer than six (6) feet and placed in a pile with all branches facing the same direction. **PILES MUST BE SEPARATED!** Our equipment cannot process mixed piles!

All yard waste must be set out by the curb – **do not put yard waste in grass medians!**

DON'T THROW AWAY OUR FUTURE



PLEASE HELP US HELP THE ENVIRONMENT BY ENSURING RECYCLABLES ARE AS CLEAN AND CONTAMINANT FREE AS POSSIBLE.

THE FOLLOWING SHOULD NOT BE PUT INTO SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING:

-  **1 NO PLASTIC BAGS.** Plastic bags are the WORST contaminant in the recycling bin. When placed in a curbside bin, they get wet and dirty and cannot be recycled. Plastic bags with a #2 or #4 can be recycled at most grocery stores if they are clean, dry and empty.
-  **2 NO MATERIALS IN PLASTIC BAGS.** Workers have to slow the conveyor belts to rip open bags that contain recyclables and then add the bag to the heap of bags bound for the landfill. These inefficiencies waste time and money.
-  **3 NO SHREDDED PAPER.** Shredded paper is too small to sort. The pieces fall through the cracks of the sorting machines, stick to the belts and end up all over the floor. Please avoid shredding when possible because it destroys the potential for recycling.
-  **4 NO SCRAP METAL.** Scrap metal items of any size should not go into your curbside bin. These items cause excessive damage to the recycling equipment. (Aluminum and steel cans are not considered scrap metal and should go in your bin).
-  **5 NO HAZARDOUS WASTE.** Hazardous waste such as paint, automotive fluids, all batteries and pesticides must be taken to your local Household Hazardous Waste Facility, not to the Single Stream Recycling Center.
-  **6 NO DIAPERS OR BIO-HAZARDOUS WASTE.** Syringes and needles, diapers and other sanitary products are not recyclable. Paper towels are also not recyclable.
-  **7 NO NONRECYCLABLE PLASTICS.** While we have added new plastic items, many plastics are still not recyclable. Plastic lids, foam (Styrofoam®) and any other plastics not listed in our recycling guidelines are not recyclable because stable markets do not exist for these materials. Polystyrene recycling drop-off is offered in a separate container at the Cecil County Central Landfill.
-  **8 NO FLATTENED CONTAINERS** The single-stream sorting equipment separates “flats” (paper) from “rounds” (containers). When containers are flattened, the equipment mistakenly sends them to the paper side of the facility, significantly contaminating the paper we’re sending to market.
-  **9 NO CAPS/LIDS ON GLASS BOTTLES OR JARS.** Metal lids can be removed and recycled loose in the bin. Plastic lids and caps from glass bottles and jars should be thrown away.
-  **10 NO LIQUIDS.** When we compact bottles for shipping, liquids drip, splatter and explode all over the floor, creating a sticky, smelly mess on the sorting floor. Please completely empty and quickly rinse out all containers before recycling.
-  **11 NO CERAMICS OR NONRECYCLABLE GLASS.** Ceramic, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex®, porcelain and window glass should not go into the bin! Their different melting points and chemical compositions will ruin new glass bottles.
-  **12 NO FROZEN FOOD CONTAINERS.** Paperboard boxes that were designed for freezer foods, such as frozen pizza and entrées, have a plastic polymer sprayed on them to protect against freezer burn. That same coating prevents the box from breaking up in the recycling process. These materials are not recyclable OR compostable.

Empty And Rinse All Containers. **PLEASE Do Not Include:** **PLASTICS** Other Than Those Listed, Plastic Film, Plastic Bags, Paint, Pesticides, Oil & Cleaners, VISYCR Tapes, Phones, Computers, Etc., Plastic Bags, Needles Or Syringes, Styrofoam To-Go Containers Organic Material And Food Waste. **PAPER** Items Other Than Those Listed, Stickers Or Address Labels Sheet Waste Waxed Paper Or Waxed Cardboard Paper To-Go Containers. **GLASS** Items Other Than Those Listed, Window Panes, Mirrors, Ceramics & Pyrex Dishware, Paint, Pesticides, Oil & Cleaners, Organic Material And Food Waste. **CANS AND METAL ITEMS** Items Other Than Those Listed, Scrap Metal, Needles Or Syringes, Paint, Pesticides, Oil & Cleaners, Electronic Waste (Batteries, Cell, Etc), Phones, Computers, Etc.

WATER CONSERVATION

Tips on conserving water inside the home:

In the Kitchen

- Run dishwasher only when full
- Consider water use when purchasing a new dishwasher: New water and energy efficient models use 20% less water
- Defrost food in refrigerator instead of using running water: A running faucet uses about a gallon of water per minute
- Use a dishpan or plug the sink when hand-washing dishes
- Don't pre-rinse dishes before loading into dishwasher: Keep a container of water in the refrigerator rather than waiting for cold water from the faucet.

In the Laundry

- Run full loads of laundry instead of many small loads
- Consider energy and water efficiency when purchasing new laundry machines: Newer models use 40% less water and can save up to 6000 gal/year.

In the Bathroom

- Install low flow toilets or toilet dams
- Test all toilets regularly for leaks: A leaking toilet could waste up 100 gal/day
- Do not use the toilet as a wastebasket
- Replace old showerheads: Low flow showerheads can save 3 gal/min
- Take shorter showers
- Turn off water when shaving or brushing teeth



Tips on conserving water outside the home:

Landscape Irrigation

- Install efficient irrigation systems such as drip irrigation, soil soakers, and efficient sprinkler systems
- Set sprinklers for lawn and garden only, don't water the street or sidewalk
- Water the lawn only when the ground is dry and preferably no more than once a week: The amount of water used by a sprinkler in one hour is equal to the daily water needs of a family of four
- Water during the coolest part of the day (preferably morning) and never water on windy days: As much as 30% of water used can be lost to evaporation by watering lawn during midday
- Pull weeds to decrease competition for water
- Increase mowing height to 2-3 inches and apply mulch to both reduce evaporation and prevent weed growth
- Limit grass areas and use trees, shrubs, and other plants that require less water to landscape your yard.

Other Outdoor Use

- Repair or replace leaking hoses and sprinklers
- Always use an automatic shut-off nozzle on hoses
- Use a broom rather than a hose to clean decks, sidewalks, and other paved areas: 5 minutes of running the hose uses 25 gallons of water
- Collect rainwater for reuse in the garden whenever possible
- Cover pools to prevent evaporation: An average uncovered pool loses about an inch of water a week because of evaporation



STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

WHAT IS STORM WATER RUN OFF??

Storm water runoff occurs when rain flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways sidewalks and streets prevent storm water runoff from naturally soaking into the ground.

Storm water pollution is one of the biggest threats to the health of our creeks, bays and rivers.

Storm Water Pollutants

- Soap
- Oil
- Antifreeze
- Yard waste
- Garden/ lawn chemicals
- Pet waste
- Littering

Pollution Prevention Tips

- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, on the grass, or on a graveled area
- Put a drip tray under your car to catch car leaks.
- Fix car leaks as soon as possible
- Mulch grass clipping on your lawn instead of placing them curbside.
- Place grass clipping into a bio-degradable yard waste bag and then set them curbside
- Compost your yard waste and pull weeds by hand.
- Avoid use of chemicals. If necessary, use sparingly and as directed.
- Scoop, double bag, and throw pet waste in the garbage.
- Throw all litter in appropriate trash cans.
- Keep litter out of pick-up truck beds and cover loads so items aren't blown off to the ground.
- Recycle and reuse items whenever possible.

Historic Elk Landing is an almost forgotten port at the head of the Chesapeake Bay. During America's late Colonial and early Federal periods, roughly 1770 to 1820, Elk Landing was the mid Atlantic's northernmost navigable inland waterway and the preferred route of north and south travel for many well-known patriots. George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and Lafayette, as well as many other patriots, passed through en route to the capitol in Philadelphia. In addition, the site served as a shipping and supply port for America's Continental Army. In the War of 1812, Fort Hollingsworth at Elk Landing, along with close-by Fort Defiance, defended Elkton from burning by the British. [info@elktonlanding.org]

Registration Information: Registrations will be accepted online, over the phone, and in person at the Recreation Office. Phone in registrations may be accepted with a credit card payment. Registration deadline is one week prior to the first class unless otherwise stated. **Payments must be received by our office prior to the start of the activity** No confirmation will be sent unless stated. You will only be notified if there is a problem in processing your registration or if the program is cancelled. Registration waiver must be signed by an adult over age 18. Only a parent/legal guardian may sign the waiver for a child. Make checks payable to the Town of Elkton. For your protection, please do not mail cash. Registration or entry may be denied into a program when it deems necessary to assure public safety. Please contact Parks & Recreation with any changes in your contact information.

Activity Information: Classes are subject to cancellation for any reasonable cause. Classes will not meet when Cecil County Public Schools are closed for inclement weather or emergencies.

Returned Check Fee – All returned checks will be charged a \$25.00 service charge. Checks will not be accepted as form of payment if first check is returned. Second payment must be made in cash, money order or with a credit card.

Please make sure an instructor is present before dropping your child off for a program. Arrive to pick up your child at least five minutes before the programs scheduled closing. Failure to pick up your child on time may result in expulsion from the program. A child may be expelled from a program with no refund after notifying parents of disciplinary problems.

The Recreation Department may photograph programs and participants for publicity purposes.

The Recreation Department has the right to adjust any of the program details listed in this brochure including fees, locations, instructors, days, starting dates, and times.

Refund Policy: Refunds will automatically be made when classes are full or cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. Refunds will not be issued after the start of a class. An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be charged for each refund you request (per person/per activity). Refunds may take up to four weeks to be processed.

FAIR SHARE POLICY

What is ETR and NR? ETR stands for Elkton Town Resident and NR stands for Non-Resident.

How do I know if I am an Elkton Town Resident or a Non-Resident? Elkton Town Residents are defined as those individuals living within the corporate limits of the Town of Elkton (anyone who pays property tax to the Town of Elkton). Non-Residents are defined as anyone not residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Elkton. **All individuals with Elkton mailing addresses are not necessarily Town of Elkton residents.**

Why do you charge different fees to residents and non-residents? The Town of Elkton, by way of property taxes, makes a substantial contribution to the operations of the Parks & Recreation Department. The fair share policy is intended to administer an equalizing fee to the overall financing of the department's operations on an equitable basis. Therefore, non-residents are required to pay an additional fee for each activity unless otherwise noted.






