Resolution R5-2009

A RESOLUTION of the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Elkton approving the application submission to the State of Maryland, Department of Housing and Community Development, for *Community Development Block Grant* funds to support the *Thomson Water Tower on East Village Road Rehabilitation* project.

WHEREAS, the State of Maryland, by its Department of Housing and Community Development, has solicited applications from eligible political subdivisions of the State to apply for funds under the *Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)* program; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Elkton is eligible to apply for funding under the aforementioned program through the Department of Housing and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Commissioners have identified and initiated development of the project, specifically the *Thomson Water Tower on East Village Road*, hereinafter "the Project", which has been described in more detail in the application; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing relating to the application under the CDBG program was held on **May 6, 2009, 7:05 p.m.** at the **Elkton Municipal Building, Council Meeting Room, 100 Railroad Avenue, Elkton, Maryland.**

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Elkton hereby resolve the following:

1. That the application be submitted to the State of Maryland, Department of Housing and Community Development, for funding assistance in the amount of Two Hundred Thirty-four Thousand Nine Hundred Ten Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$234,910.50) under the Maryland Community Development Block Grant program for the Project; and
2. That Mayor Joseph L. Fisona shall hereby be authorized and empowered to execute any and all documents required for the submission of said application.
