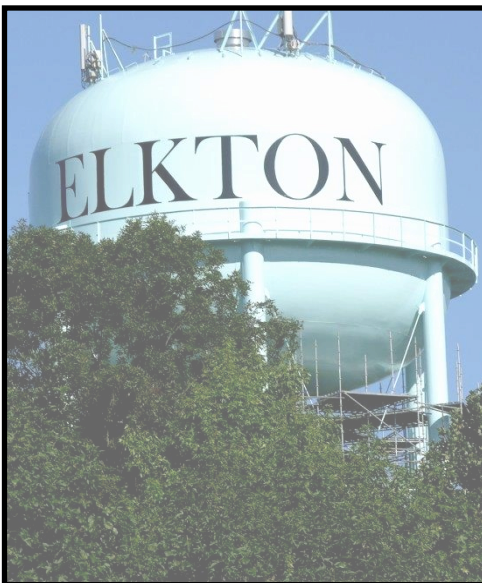




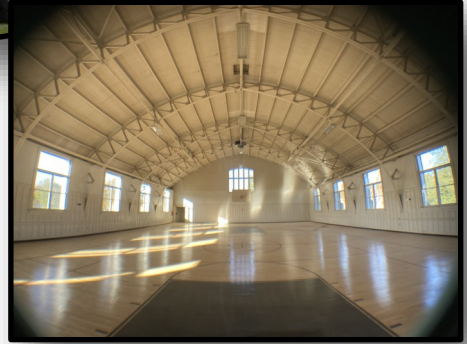

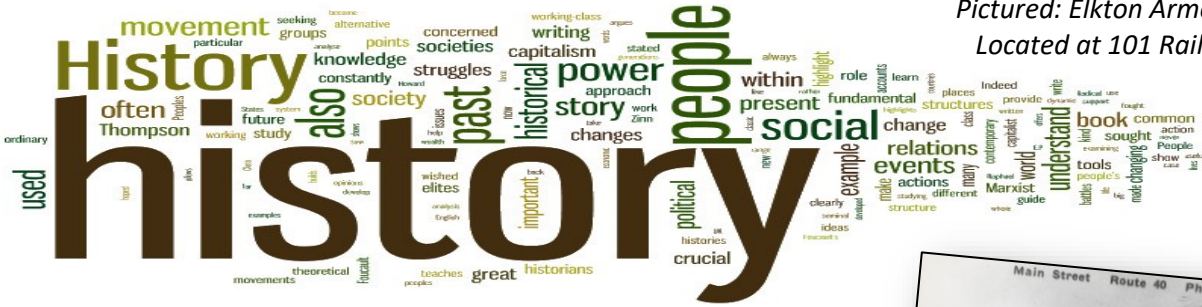
Welcome!

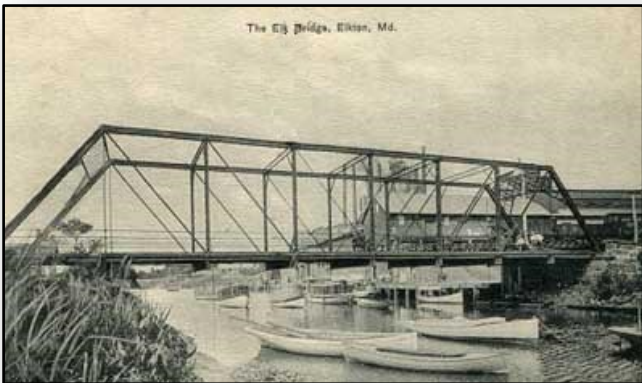

In 1608, the land on which the Town now sits was named “Head of Elk” by the English explorer Captain John Smith. In 1681, the original tract of land was given to Nicholas Painter who named it “Friendship”. The Town that evolved was known as “Head of Elk” until 1787, when it was incorporated as “Elkton”.



The Town became an early shipping point for the wheat grown in the rich piedmont surrounding the settlement. The Big and Little Elk creeks also supplied water power for small paper and textile factories in the early nineteenth century.

The Planning Director represents the Town and Cecil County municipalities on our regional transportation planning agency - the Wilmington Area Planning Council Technical Advisory Committee (WILMAPCO TAC) and represents Elkton on the WILMAPCO Data and Demographics Subcommittee. The Director is also a member of the Cecil County Economic Development Commission Land Use Subcommittee, and is on the Board of Directors for the Historic Elk Landing Foundation.

The Planning Department is responsible for administering and recommending amendments to Elkton's elected officials on land use regulations, and coordinates reviews of site plans, subdivisions, annexations, rezoning, special exceptions, and other land-planning issues for compliance with various applicable laws. The Planning Department is staff to the Elkton Planning Commission and Elkton Historic District Commission. The Planning Department is also responsible for grant research, and application & administration of state and federal grants such as the Community Development Block Grant, Critical Area Grant, Community Legacy, Sidewalk Retrofit, Maryland Historical Trust and Program Open Space Grants.



"Town Square Project - This project, located 101 East Main Street, improved the layout and provided ADA accessible ramps from Main Street to the Elkton Town Square and to the Elkton Chamber and Alliance Offices and Elkton Visitor Center. The MD Community Development Block Grant program provided \$135,000 in funding assistance. The project was essentially completed on November 18, 2019 - just in time for the lighting of the Christmas tree in the Town Square!"

"Neighborhood Community Center at 121 Stockton Street, Elkton, Maryland. (left) The MD Community Development Block Grant program (CDBG) provided \$800,000 in funding assistance for this 19,840 square foot building constructed on 2.38 acres of property. This building includes gymnasium space suitable for indoor sports and exercise activities and classroom spaces for dance, day camp, science and cooking classes and a wide variety of programs offered by the Elkton Department of Parks and Recreation. The property was originally part of a playground for the former George Washington Carver Elementary School (currently Cecil County Board of Education Offices). The Town of Elkton identified this location as ideal due to its location in the downtown and within walking distance of many neighborhoods."

BRUSH, GRASS & LEAF COLLECTION



The daily route begins at 6:30 a.m. The Department of Public Works (DPW) asks that all residents place their grass, leaves and/or brush out **the night before**. DPW cannot return to areas previously serviced that day.

Please Note: Collection routes are weather permitting. When grass, leaves and brush get wet, they may not be picked up on collection day; wet materials can damage equipment.

DPW does not pick up: vines, mulch, rocks/stones, dirt, roots/root balls, garden vegetation, ornamental grasses, landscaping timbers, weed block or sticks mixed with grass & leaves.

Do not place grass, leaves and/or brush in bags. You can place grass in a container marked "GRASS" in four (4) inch letters. Containers must not exceed 32 gallons.

Storm Water Pollutants

- Soap
- Garden/ Lawn Chemicals
- Oil
- Pet Waste
- Antifreeze
- Littering
- Yard Waste

Pollution Prevention Tips

- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, on the grass, or on a graveled area
- pull weeds by hand.
- Put a drip tray under your car to catch car leaks.
- Avoid use of chemicals. If necessary, use sparingly and as directed.
- Fix car leaks as soon as possible
- Scoop, double bag, and throw pet waste in the garbage.
- Mulch grass clipping on your lawn instead of placing them curbside.
- Throw all litter in appropriate trash cans.
- Place grass clipping into a biodegradable yard waste bag and then set them curbside
- Keep litter out of pick-up truck beds and cover loads so items aren't blown off to the ground.
- Compost your yard waste and
- Recycle and reuse items whenever possible.

WATER CONSERVATION

Tips on conserving water inside the home:

In the Kitchen

- 💧 Run dishwasher only when full
- 💧 Consider water use when purchasing a new dishwasher:
 - 💧 New water and energy efficient models use 20% less water
- 💧 Defrost food in refrigerator instead of using running water:
 - 💧 A running faucet uses about a gallon of water per minute
- 💧 Use a dishpan or plug the sink when hand-washing dishes
- 💧 Don't pre-rinse dishes before loading into dishwasher:
 - 💧 Keep a container of water in the refrigerator rather than waiting for cold water from the faucet.

In the Laundry

- 💧 Run full loads of laundry instead of many small loads
- 💧 Consider energy and water efficiency when purchasing new laundry machines: Newer models use 40% less water and can save up to 6000 gal/year.

In the Bathroom

- 💧 Install low flow toilets or toilet dams
- 💧 Test all toilets regularly for leaks: A leaking toilet could waste up 100 gal/day
- 💧 Do not use the toilet as a wastebasket
- 💧 Replace old showerheads: Low flow showerheads can save 3 gal/min
- 💧 Take shorter showers
- 💧 Turn off water when shaving or brushing teeth



Tips on conserving water outside the home:

Landscape Irrigation

- 💧 Install efficient irrigation systems such as drip irrigation, soil soakers, and efficient sprinkler systems
- 💧 Set sprinklers for lawn and garden only, don't water the street or sidewalk
- 💧 Water the lawn only when the ground is dry and preferably no more than once a week: The amount of water used by a sprinkler in one hour is equal to the daily water needs of a family of four
- 💧 Water during the coolest part of the day (preferably morning) and never water on windy days: As much as 30% of water used can be lost to evaporation by watering lawn during midday
- 💧 Pull weeds to decrease competition for water
- 💧 Increase mowing height to 2-3 inches and apply mulch to both reduce evaporation and prevent weed growth
- 💧 Limit grass areas and use trees, shrubs, and other plants that require less water to landscape your yard.

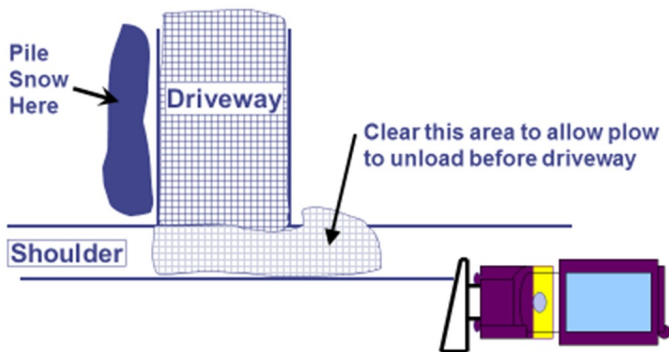
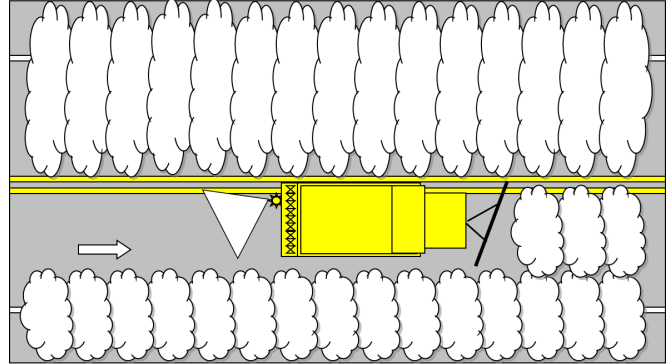
Other Outdoor Use

- 💧 Repair or replace leaking hoses and sprinklers
- 💧 Always use an automatic shut-off nozzle on hoses
- 💧 Use a broom rather than a hose to clean decks, sidewalks, and other paved areas: 5 minutes of running the hose uses 25 gallons of water
- 💧 Collect rainwater for reuse in the garden whenever possible
- 💧 Cover pools to prevent evaporation: An average uncovered pool loses about an inch of water a week because of evaporation



Weather Preparedness

To efficiently plow snow from the roadway, snow plow operators always push snow to their immediate right.

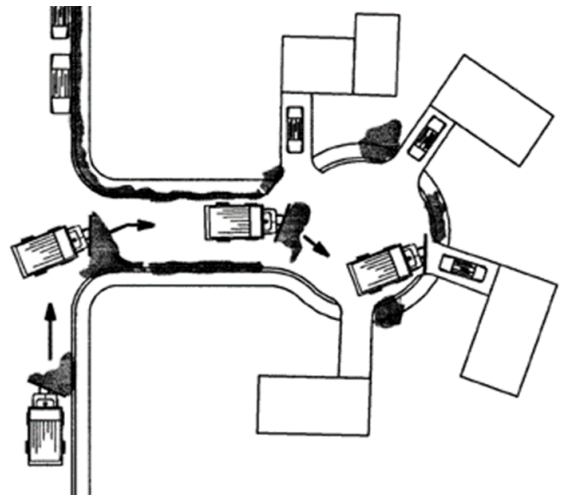


DPW asks residents to place shoveled snow along side their driveway and/or clear an area on the side of the driveway apron to reduce the amount of snow blocking their driveway.

Cul-De-Sac's:

There are not many places for operators to push snow.

It is very imperative that residents who live in cul-de-sac's park in their driveways so operators can plow snow efficiently.

Historic Elk Landing

Head of Elk ~ Elkton, MD

Historic Elk Landing is an almost forgotten port at the head of the Chesapeake Bay. During America's late Colonial and early Federal periods, roughly 1770 to 1820, Elk Landing was the mid Atlantic's northernmost navigable inland waterway and the preferred route of north and south travel for many well-known patriots. George Washington, Thomas Jefferson and Lafayette, as well as many other patriots, passed through en route to the capitol in Philadelphia. In addition, the site served as a shipping and supply port for America's Continental Army. In the War of 1812, Fort Hollingsworth at Elk Landing, along with close-by Fort Defiance, defended Elkton from burning by the British.

Elk Landing is part of the Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route. In September of 1781, the combined Franco-American Army of about 2,600 men under the command of General George Washington and the Comte de Rochambeau marched south from New England on the way to Virginia and encamped at Head of Elk, while Washington procured vessels to transport the army down the Chesapeake Bay. Some troops embarked by water but a portion of the army marched overland via Baltimore.

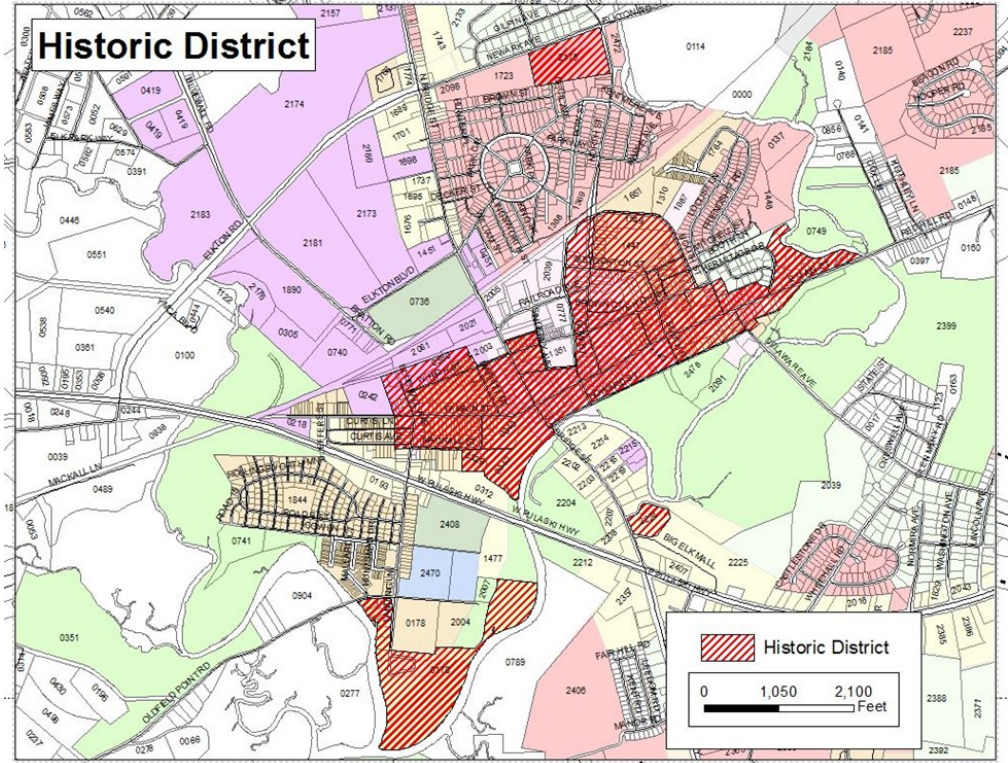

ELKTON HISTORIC DISTRICT

What is the Elkton Historic District?

The Town of Elkton Historic District is an area of historically significant buildings, sites, structures and objects which embody the rich history of Elkton. Established by the Elkton Comprehensive Plan and the Town of Elkton Zoning Ordinance, the Historic District was created to preserve the historic character and significant architectural resources of Elkton, but also serves to enhance the quality of life in the community by encouraging preservation and rehabilitation, increasing property values, promoting local tourism, and fostering an appreciation for local history.



How do I know if my property is located in the Historic District?

The Historic District includes almost 500 historic buildings, sites, structures and objects in a range of ages and architectural styles. Residents of Elkton can determine whether their property is located in the Historic District by consulting the Historic District Map available online at www.elkton.org/planning, (Comprehensive Plan, pg. 11-3) or by contacting the Elkton Planning Department, 100 Railroad Avenue, Elkton, MD 21921

What types of work require a Historic District Work Permit?

Property owners of a building within the Elkton Historic District are required to obtain a Historic District Work Permit prior to the initiation of any construction, alteration, demolition or reconstruction activities, any part of which is visible from a public way. The cost for a Historic District Permit Application is currently \$50.00. The application is reviewed and approved by Elkton's Historic District Commission.

Routine maintenance which does not alter the exterior fabric or features of a site or structure does not require a Historic District Work Permit. Consult the Elkton Zoning Ordinance for more information about the Historic District Work Permit requirements, available online at www.elkton.org/planning (Elkton Zoning Ordinance, Article IX, Part III).

Yes, yard sales are permitted. Please stop in Town Hall to fill out a yard sale permit before having your yard sale!

Do I need a permit to sell flowers for holidays??

If you are selling flowers, trees, etc. for special occasions, or if you are interested in a food venue a **transient vendors license** is required. To learn more about a transient vendors license go to www.elkton.org/files to view the application & requirements.

Am I allowed to burn yard waste??

No burning of any kind is permitted in Town limits. Refer to the Town Code Title 8, Chapter 8.04 Section 8.04.040

Which department do I call for an abandoned vehicle??

If the abandoned vehicle is on the street, contact the Police Dept (911-non-emergency). If the vehicle is in a yard or driveway, contact the Building Dept at 410-398-4999

Where do I pay water/ sewer bills and parking tickets??

All parking tickets and water/ sewer bills are paid at the Town Finance Office (100 Railroad Ave)

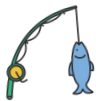
